

## Testimony of Kimberly McCullough, Policy Director In Support of HB 2090 Senate Committee on Business and Transportation May 10, 2017

Chair Beyer and Members of the Committee:

**The American Civil Liberties Union of Oregon**<sup>1</sup> **supports HB 2090**, which would protect Oregonians by:

- (a) Requiring businesses to follow their own privacy policies; and
- (b) Allowing the Attorney General to hold businesses accountable for violations of those privacy policies through Oregon's consumer protection law.

In today's world, using the Internet has become a fundamental part of living in our society, participating in our democracy, and exercising our constitutional rights, including those around speech, expression, religion, and association. Yet each time we use the Internet, businesses who operate in the digital world we interact with gather information about us. This information can reveal so much about us and our personal lives, including our location, interests, political views, relationships, deeply-held beliefs, health, and finances. If this information is not secure, it can have a serious chilling effect on people's use of the Internet.

Oregonians should not have to sacrifice their privacy rights and lose control over their personal information in order to use the Internet. Instead, they should be given the power to understand, influence, and control the dissemination of their personal information. Holding businesses accountable by requiring them to follow stated privacy policies will help to put that power in Oregonians' hands.

HB 2090 is a common-sense bill to ensure that Oregonians can trust that the information they share with businesses will only be used and shared consistent with those businesses' stated privacy policies. And if that trust is violated, HB 2090 will give the Attorney General the ability to stand up for Oregon consumers' rights.
