I am a renter in N. Portland. I fear that I will come home any day and find a rent increase notice or no-cause eviction notice that would force me out of my home. Please pass HB 2004 to provide stability and security for renters throughout Oregon.

I also work as a tenant organizer in NE Portland's Cully neighborhood. My organization, Living Cully, has worked to support 18 low-income families at the Normandy Apartments who received rent increases of over 100%. Almost all of them are desperately looking for new homes, and the vast majority are forced to move far from their neighborhood and community, and their children's schools.
