FOSTER PARENT SURVEY – 2016 – Overview of STATISTICS / RESULTS from 160+ Foster Parents

- 70% of foster parents feel they are only sometimes or never a valued member of their foster child's "Team"
- Over 50% of Foster Parents report not being well informed of the case plan, court dates, upcoming changes, etc. by DHS
- Over 50% of Foster Parents report they are not given enough information about foster parent rights
- Only 38% of Foster Parents would know how to go about obtaining current caretaker status to be considered as an adoptive resource for a foster child in their home
- Over 60% of Foster Parents think that case workers do not spend enough time getting to know their foster child and foster family
- Approximately 60% of foster parents fear that speaking up against or reporting a case worker would result
 in retribution. 30% report never having had a reason to report a case worker. 10% say they do not fear
 retribution.
- Foster parents report not receiving adequate information upon a child's initial placement. 77% do not receive enough info about a child's background, 63% do not receive enough info about a child's behavioral challenges, 56% do not receive enough information about medical needs
- Approximately half of foster parents feel they do not receive enough support the first week after child placement
- Only 35% of foster parents report that child visits with biological relatives are well organized, supported and reasonable
- 58% of Foster parents think that there is sufficient ongoing training for foster parents (about trauma, child sex abuse, attachment, etc.), 29% think this could be improved, and only 7% think there is not enough training available.
- Only 22% of foster parents think there are sufficient services/grief counseling/support available to their family when a foster child leaves their home.
- Over 90% of foster parents would like to receive child updates after a child is removed from their home
- 72% of Foster parents are interested in attending a Town Hall Meeting
