My children have been raised helping me clean and restore several homes in the Salem area, in areas that aren't in the most desirable location.

We have had both horrible tenants and the best of tenants.

As a landlord, I have NEVER had a rent increase from the time my tenant moved in, until they moved out. Some have been in our places for nearly a decade.

This catch all ridiculous bill does not work for us, yet we would be hurt financially and emotionally by it, if it ever had to come into play for us.

Please reconsider this bill, and again, think about what it would/could mean for your family or loved ones financially, if they were in my position. We should not be required to pay anybody's rent.
