WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Authorizes professional licensing boards to consider, and substitute, relevant experience for high school diploma or equivalent education requirement.

- No revenue or expenditure impacts
- Senate vote 29-0

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Board's discretion to accept experience in lieu of high school diploma or equivalent
- Whether measure serves as disincentive for completing high school
- Needs of developmentally disabled population

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

For various occupations, practitioners are required to obtain a license or similar credentials from a state licensing board or agency. The required criteria for obtaining licensure, certification and other professional and occupational credentials are specific to each occupation, but may include practical training, completion of a specified level of education and passing a relevant exam.

Senate Bill 1028 permits professional licensing boards to consider, and accept, an applicant's relevant experience in the place of a high school diploma or equivalent in order to fulfill licensure, certification or other occupational and professional service authorization requirements.
