Subject: SB 375 Relating to posting at roadside rest areas informational materials on human trafficking - Work Session Recommendations

SB 375 creates the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) Human Trafficking Awareness Fund and the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) Human Trafficking Awareness Fund, which are both separate and distinct from the General Fund. It authorizes ODOT and OPRD to receive gifts, grants or contributions from any source for deposit into the newly created funds.

The bill provides for nonprofit organizations to supply ODOT, OPRD, and the Travel Information Council with copies of informational materials about human trafficking. The bill specifies that when ODOT and OPRD determine that each agency has received a sufficient legislative appropriation or other funding to cover the costs, these agencies may post human trafficking materials provided by non-profits in all rest room stalls of each roadside rest area in Oregon.

The fiscal impact of the bill is anticipated to be minimal. The Legislative Fiscal Office notes that the posting of materials could increase cleaning and management costs due to vandalism.

The measure previously had hearings in the Senate Committee on Judiciary on 2/15/2017 and 3/29/2017. The original staff measure summary and the fiscal impact statement are available on the Oregon Legislative Information System (OLIS).

Final Subcommittee Action

LFO recommends that SB 375 be moved to the Ways and Means Full Committee.
