This bill contains provisions for widening highways at great expense. This has been proven time and again in cities around the globe to only increase congestion. We do not want our highways widened!

This bill introduces a sales tax on bicycles to fund bike and pedestrian infrastructure, which seems fair. But the reason we need this infrastructure is to keep people safe from cars!

Bicycles and pedestrians do not damage the roadways, cars do. Cars, trucks, and studded tires do thousands of times more damage to the roads, and should be taxed commensurately.
