Dear Members of the Join Committee on Transportation Preservation and Modernization,

I am writing to ask you to amend the policy language on HB 2017-3 regarding a bicycle sales tax. I own a small business in the bicycle industry and this will hurt my business. An industry that has already been hit hard by the effects of online sales. We should not be taxing activities or businesses that support h ealthy, vibrant communities and reduce congestion on roadways. I, and other bicycle riding people, alread y pay disproportionately more for highways and freeways that impact our communities negatively with p ollution and noise. Oregon should not be taxing healthy activities while continuing to invest hundreds of millions on short sited, Automotive congestion relief projects. I already pay my fair share in transportatio n taxes and get crumbs in investment for the transportation mode I and my clients use the most.

Safe facilities for bicycling and walking are critical in Oregon communities. Such investments belong in a balanced transportation funding package. The 3% bicycle tax currently proposed in not the path to fundi ng these improvements. Everyone in our communities benefits from these investments in safe and health y communities, so the tax burden should be shared more broadly. As currently written, this bill will have a negative impact on small Oregon businesses and on Oregonians choosing to travel in way that improves health and eases congestion.

Please remove the bicycle salestax from HB 2017, and maintain new funding for bicycle and pedestrian fa cilities through a more broad based, low tax.
