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## Oregon Youth Authority Testimony in Support of SB 5506

Honorable Members of the Joint Subcommittee on Capital Construction, the Oregon Youth Authority (OYA) asks for your support of SB 5506. SB 5506 includes \$50 million capital construction dollars for OYA to resolve deferred maintenance and to continue with our Ten-Year Facilities Plan.

The bonding funds for OYA in SB 5506, continue a joint agency and legislative effort prompted by a 2013 budget note from the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. The budget note directed us to perform a facilities audit, and as it relates to facilities:

- 1. Evaluate facilities in terms of capacity, operating and maintenance cost, and deferred maintenance need.
- 2. Develop 10-year plans for OYA facilities.

The first biennium of funding allocated to fulfill the Ten-Year Facilities Plan was 2015-17. We are pleased to report we are well underway to completing the 2015-17 efforts (Table A). These projects include:

- Critical deferred maintenance; HVAC, mechanical, electrical, plumbing, and roof replacements.
- Building six new living units at MacLaren Youth Correctional Facility (YCF) aligned with the safety
  and treatment needs of some of our most difficult-to-manage youth to replace the programobsolete Geer Compound at MacLaren YCF and Hillcrest YCF, both of which would have required
  significant investments to address deferred maintenance. This construction allows the closure
  of Hillcrest.
- A high school/multi-purpose treatment building and recreation fields at our Rogue Valley YCF that will provide much-needed population density relief when it's done later this year.
- Digital surveillance cameras in all our facilities for the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA), which contribute to youth and staff safety.

Thank you for the support over the past biennia. Moving forward, we hope to hold the gains and continue the momentum.

The 2017-2019 Governor's Recommended Budget, SB 5505, and SB 5506 each recommend continuation of the Ten-Year Facilities Plan through a \$50 million reinvestment in OYA's physical plants (Table B).

The 2017-19 portion of the Ten-Year Facilities Plan has two major objectives:

 To resolve deferred maintenance. (The current amount is \$23 million; or \$17.2 million after deducting any work done in the living unit remodels.) Resolve deferred maintenance in the front cottages at MacLaren YCF and the living units at
Rogue Valley YCF, and renovate for Positive Human Development program alignment. The work
at Rogue Valley YCF will serve as a proof-of concept for living units with the same layout and
construction.

The work done to date and within the 2017-2019 request is consistent with the blueprint created within the Ten-Year Facilities Plan. The blueprint outlined for OYA facilities that we:

- take advantage of our existing buildings, and utilize their existing positive physical plant features;
- prioritize projects that resolve deferred maintenance;
- bring our older buildings up to seismic code; and
- focus on efficient reconstruction of buildings as we resolve deferred maintenance needs, by completing innovative improvements to more closely align OYA's physical environments with our culture of Positive Human Development and the Youth Reformation System.

We will issue the first invitations-to-bid once we have bond authority in July of this year. As with all our projects, we focus on creating Oregon jobs, and specifically encourage local contractors (local to the project) to bid the work.

Oregon Youth Authority's mission is to protect the public; reduce crime by holding youth offenders accountable; and to provide opportunities for reformation in safe environments. Funding for these projects supports this by helping to make sure our building spaces are in good condition, secure and safe, and aligned with our innovative reformation treatment programs.
