Subject: SB 214 – Relating to the eligibility of post-doctoral scholars for retirement benefits
Work Session Recommendations

Senate Bill 214 relates to the eligibility of post-doctoral scholars for retirement benefits. The measure is a narrowly defined technical adjustment to statute. The measure is effective on the 91st day after adjournment; however, the measure applies only to a post-doctoral scholar who begins employment as a post-doctoral scholar on or after the effective date of the measure. The Senate Committee on Workforce held a public hearing (3/6) and the work session on the measure (4/10). The measure passed from Senate Workforce to Ways and Means without recommendation. A preliminary staff measure summary, fiscal impact, revenue impact, and amendment are available on the Oregon Legislative Information System (OLIS). The measure and amendment have a minimal expenditure impact and no revenue impact.

There is a -2 amendment to the measure, which replaces the measure.

Recommended Changes

LFO recommends adoption of the -2 amendment.

MOTION: I move adoption of the -2 amendment to SB 214. (VOTE)

Final Subcommittee Action

LFO recommends that SB 214, as amended by the -2 amendment, to be moved to the Ways and Means Full Committee.
