Psychologists do not have the medical and pharmacology training in psychoactive drugs. This bill would put the lives of the mental health patients in potential jeopardy.

National and local physician societies have consistently opposed prescribing privileges for psychologists, primarily because of patient safety concerns arising from the complex effects of psychotropic medications on the body. While psychologists play an important role in the delivery of healthcare, typically they do not have a knowledge base for a thorough diagnosis of the patient necessary to safely prescribe.
