SB 483 Relating to unlawful use of a global positioning system device Subject:

**Work Session Recommendations** 

Senate Bill 483 creates the crime of unlawful use of a GPS device by knowingly attaching it to a vehicle without the consent of the owner. The crime is classified as a Class A misdemeanor, unless the individual has a previous conviction for stalking or is violating a court order for stalking, in which case it becomes a Class C felony.

The staff measure summary and the fiscal impact statement are available on the Oregon Legislative Information System (OLIS). The measure previously had a public hearing in the Public Safety Subcommittee on June 12th.

The measure is anticipated to have a minimal fiscal impact to the Department of Corrections, Judicial Department, District Attorney's and their Deputies, and the Public Defense Services Commission.
