Subject: HB 2992 – Relating to criminal records checks for schools

The bill requires public school districts or public charter schools, and permits private schools, to adopt and implement a policy to require volunteers to undergo a background check. The bill has an indeterminate fiscal impact, however \$442,500 in Other Funds expenditure limitation will be included in the Department of Education budget (SB 5516) to account for the potential increase in criminal background checks conducted under ORS 181A.195.

Recommended Changes

LFO recommends adoption of the -A3 amendment which expands existing school volunteer and employment background check law to permit the option of a nationwide criminal records check conducted by the Department of Education (ODE).
