Subject: HB 3440 – Relating to drugs
Work Session Recommendations

This bill removes special training requirements from statutes governing prescribing, dispensing and distributing naloxone and requires OHA to publish and report information related to opioids and opiates.

The -A7 amendment adds in the provisions of HB 2518 to make changes to the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) and expand the pool of participating practitioners to include practitioners from all states.

A preliminary staff measure summary and fiscal impact statement are available on the Oregon Legislative Information System (OLIS). OHA will need staff to manage the addition of approximately 20,000 practitioners to the PDMP. Expenditure limitation will be added to the omnibus budget bill to cover those expenses. LFO recommends the -A7 amendment.

Recommended Changes

LFO recommends adoption of the -A7 amendment.

LFO recommends that HB 3440, as amended by the -A7 amendment, be moved to the Ways and Means Full Committee.
