

**Re:** HB 2310 Relating to the provision of public health services

Representative Rayfield: "HB 2310 modifies and clarifies requirements established in HB 3100 from the 2015 session for modernizing the state's public health system. The bill modifies the timeline and process for submitting local public health implementation plans, and clarifies formula distribution language. It also clarifies how and when a county could relinquish their local public health authority to the state.

The recommended amendment removes requirements for implementation of specific parts of statute, thus eliminating a direct fiscal impact. However, it is anticipated that some funding will be included to begin implementing this program. The amendment also removes the section authorizing OHA to establish fees related to data requests.

The Human Services Subcommittee recommends HB 2310 be amended by the –A5 amendment and be reported out do pass, as amended."
