Re: County Video Lottery Allocations of 2.5%

Co-Chairs Devlin and Nathanson:

AOC and counties write in support of a return to a legislative allocation of the full 2.5% video lottery moneys to counties for economic development activities (minus a reduction for administration of the Governor's Regional Solution program), based on the actual distribution formula established in ORS Chapter 461.547. This video lottery provision was established by the Legislature in 1991, in return for counties giving up their authority to authorize, regulate and tax gaming.

In the 2011 session, the Legislature suspended the formula calculation and moved to a fixed funding amount each quarter, the total of which would not exceed that forecast in the May revenue forecast of each long session. Since the 2011 change, the counties have lost funding in 3 of the 4 biennia. We are willing to accept the losses with the gains.

Though in 2011 the legislative sense may have been that they were serving the better interest of counties by moving to a fixed-funding amount, the results have not shown that to be true over time. We believe it is best to return to the "deal" laid out in ORS 461.547. We have indications you will make this decision in the final lottery allocation bill, and we seek your support for this change.
