HB 3470 Program Changes

HB 3470 as amended makes the necessary changes in statutes and session laws to support the 2017-19 legislatively adopted budget, to clarify the application of statutes for the budget, and to modify provisions relating to the use of funds. This non-appropriation bill is necessary to achieve a balanced budget for the 2017-19 biennium. Specifically, the measure:

- Extends the repeal date on various statutes, including: a report on the State Treasurer's investment statutes; determining the allocation of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math and Career and Technical Education resources after passage of Ballot Measure 98; authorizes the Department of Human Services to appear as a party in juvenile court proceeding without appearance of an attorney; suspends certain Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program services; and extends current law related to legislator and other elected official salaries.
- Transfers the Oregon Volunteers Commission for Voluntary Action and Service from the Housing and Community Services Department to the Office of the Governor and transfers Connect Oregon loan repayments from the Department of Transportation to the Oregon Business Development Department.
- Changes the allocation of state marijuana tax revenues moneys, changes the
 method by which cities and counties receive state marijuana tax allocations, and
 directs the Office of Economic Analysis to forecast state marijuana tax revenues.
- Allows the Oregon Liquor Control Commission to continue to temporarily borrow from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission Account to pay expenses of the Marijuana Control Commission Account.

- Allows counties to continue to reallocate up to one-half of General Fund appropriated for county law libraries to conciliation and mediation services.
- Transfers \$111.3 million of various fund balances to the General Fund for general governmental purposes.
- And, makes various other changes specified in the fiscal impact statement and staff measure summary.

The bill has an emergency clause and is effective on passage.

The Capital Construction Subcommittee recommends HB 3470 be amended by the –8 amendment and be reported out do pass, as amended.
