## SUMMARY

Prohibits certain activities by, and specifies additional duties for, performing rights society in notifying business proprietors concerning proprietors' duties with respect to performing copyrighted musical works and in negotiating contracts for paying royalties for performing copyrighted musical works.

5 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

6 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part 7 of ORS 647.700 to 647.730.

8 <u>SECTION 2.</u> A performing rights society may not collect royalties, 9 fees, penalties or other amounts for performing copyrighted musical 10 works or enter into a contract to collect royalties for performing a 11 copyrighted musical work unless the performing rights society is au-12 thorized to do business in this state.

13 **SECTION 3.** ORS 646.607 is amended to read:

646.607. A person engages in an unlawful trade practice if in the courseof the person's business, vocation or occupation the person:

(1) Employs any unconscionable tactic in connection with selling, renting
 or disposing of real estate, goods or services, or collecting or enforcing an
 obligation;

promised, and at a customer's request, fails to refund money that the customer gave to the person to purchase the undelivered real estate, goods or services and that the person does not retain pursuant to any right, claim or defense the person may assert in good faith. This subsection does not create a warranty obligation and does not apply to a dispute over the quality of real estate, goods or services delivered to a customer;

7 (3) Violates ORS 401.965 (2);

8 (4) Violates a provision of ORS 646A.725 to 646A.750;

9 (5) Violates ORS 646A.530;

10 (6) Employs a collection practice that is unlawful under ORS 646.639;

11 (7) Is a beneficiary that violates ORS 86.726 (1)(a) or (2), 86.729 (4) or 12 86.732 (1) or (2);

13 (8) Violates ORS 646A.093;

14 (9) Violates a provision of ORS 646A.600 to 646A.628;

15 (10) Violates ORS 646A.808 (2); or

16 (11) Violates ORS 336.184.

18 **SECTION 4.** ORS 647.700 is amended to read:

19 647.700. As used in ORS 647.700 to 647.730[, unless the context requires 20 otherwise]:

(1) "Copyright owner" means [the owner of] a person that owns a copyright [of a nondramatic musical or similar work] that is recognized and enforceable under the [copyright laws of the United States pursuant to title 17 of the United States Code] Copyright Act of 1976 (P.L. 94-553, 17 U.S.C. 101 et seq.), and other copyright laws and regulations of the United States.

[(2) "Nondramatic" means the public performance of a recorded, broadcast or live musical work. "Nondramatic" does not include the performance of a dramatic work, including a play.]

30 (2) "Perform" means to disseminate a musical work by playing a 31 recording of the musical work in public or by broadcasting the musical 1 work by means of radio, the Internet or other means or to perform a
2 musical work live in public.

3 (3) "Performing rights society" means an association or corporation that 4 [licenses the public performances of nondramatic musical works on] grants a 5 license on behalf of a copyright [owners] owner to perform a copyrighted 6 musical work, including but not limited to the following societies and 7 corporations:

8 (a) The American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP);

9 (b) Broadcast Music, Inc. (BMI); and

10 (c) The Society of European Stage Authors and Composers (SESAC).

(4) "Proprietor" means [the] **an** owner of a [retail establishment, restaurant, inn, bar, tavern, sports or entertainment facility or any other similar] place of business or professional office located in this state in which the public may assemble and in which [nondramatic musical works or similar] copyrighted **musical** works may be performed[, broadcast or otherwise transmitted for the enjoyment of members of the public there assembled].

(5) "Royalty" [or "royalties"] means [the fees payable] a payment or other
consideration provided to a copyright owner or performing rights society
for [the public performance of nondramatic musical works or other similar
works] a license to perform a musical work.

21 **SECTION 5.** ORS 647.705 is amended to read:

647.705. A performing rights society [*shall*] **may** not enter into, or offer to enter into, a contract [*for the payment of royalties by a*] **under the terms of which a** proprietor **must pay royalties** unless the performing rights society **first:** 

(1) Agrees to provide to the proprietor [upon request at the proprietor's
place of business, by electronic means or otherwise] at least three business

[(1)] (a) Information in writing as to whether specific copyrighted mu sical works are in the repertoire of the performing rights society;

7 (d) Information as to whether the proposed contract waives any 8 claims for infringement based on any of the proprietor's previous un-9 licensed uses of copyrighted musical works that are within the per-10 forming rights society's repertory of copyrighted musical works; and

(2) Provides, free of charge, electronic access to and the means by
 which to search by artist or song a complete and accurate listing of
 the performing rights society's entire repertory of copyrighted musical
 works.

15 **SECTION 6.** ORS 647.710 is amended to read:

16 647.710. [Every contract for the payment of royalties between a proprietor 17 and a performing rights society executed, issued or renewed in this state shall

*be:*] A contract that a performing rights society executes or renews in
this state under which a proprietor pays royalties must be:

- 21 (2) Signed by the parties; and
- 22 (3) Written to include, at a minimum, the following information:

(a) The proprietor's name and business address and the name and location
of each place of business to which the contract applies;

(d) The schedule of rates and terms of the royalties [to be collected] the
performing rights society will collect under the contract, including any
sliding scale or schedule for any increase or decrease of the rates for the

647.715. (1) A performing rights society or any agent or employee [thereof
 shall] of a performing rights society may not:

3 [(a) Enter onto the premises of a proprietor's business for the purpose of 4 discussing or inquiring about a contract for the payment of royalties with the 5 proprietor or the proprietor's employees, without first providing identification 6 to the proprietor or the proprietor's employees and making known to them the 7 purpose of the discussion or inquiry;]

8 (a) Enter onto the premises of a proprietor's business without first:
9 (A) Providing written notice to the proprietor 72 hours before the
10 time of entry;

(B) Providing identification to the proprietor or the proprietor's
 employees; and

(C) Specifying the purpose of the entry before communicating with

 royalties;

(b) Use abusive, profane or obscene language when communicating
 with a proprietor or the proprietor's employees;

17 **SECTION 9.** ORS 647.725 is amended to read:

18 647.725. The rights, remedies and prohibitions [contained] in ORS 647.700 19 to 647.730 [shall be] **are** in addition to and cumulative to any other right, 20 remedy or prohibition accorded by common law, federal law or the statutes 21 of this state[,]. [and nothing contained in] ORS 647.700 to 647.730 [shall be 22 construed to] **do not** deny, abrogate or impair any common law or statutory 23 right, remedy or prohibition.

24 <u>SECTION 10.</u> Section 2 of this 2017 Act and the amendments to ORS 25 646.607, 647.700, 647.705, 647.710, 647.715, 647.720 and 647.725 by sections 26 3 to 9 of this 2017 Act apply to contracts into which a performing 27 rights society enters on or after the effective date of this 2017 Act.
