Highest: Alaska at \$17,487.56 / FTE;

Lowest: New Hampshire at \$2,904.21 / FTE;

U.S. average: \$6,965.63 / FTE

• FY 14 44th \$4,514.53 / FTE

• FY 13 46th \$4,219.62 / FTE

• FY 12 47th \$4,136.33 / FTE

• FY 11 46th \$4,750.31 / FTE
















Average 2016-17 In-State Tuition and Fees by State Public Four-Year Institutions


















Average 2015-16 State Grant Aid per FTE UG Student, by State

















Western Tuition Promise

- Approved by State Board of Higher Education in 2007
 - All new undergraduates from Oregon and WUE states
- Promise locks in tuition for 4 years about 35% of new students select this program
- Average family income of Promise tends to be less than traditional plan
 - Analogous to fixed rate mortgage
- Risk to university—forego future tuition increases








2015 Fall Enrollment at OSU

- 25,006 undergraduates (approx. 29% independent & 71% dependent)
- 4,262 graduate and professional students
- 18,477 students are from Oregon (63%)
- 2525 Bridge to Success (Pell and OOG recipients) gift aid for tuition and fees
 - \$7,503,137 in Institutional Aid
 - 42.5% First Generation
 - 41.2% Domestic Minorities
 - 21.8% Legacy (Qualified Families)



Of <u>all</u> of the financial aid distributed (federal, state, university and other) in the '15-'16 academic year, OSU students received a total of \$257,495,999 in aid.
