










## TRAVELER COUNTS (in millions)




The number of travelers entering TIC-managed restrooms (or extrapolated from vehicle-counters at some locations). Last 5 rest areas transferred March 1, 2014.



## FUNDING VS. OPERATING COSTS




Rest Area Funding allocated by the Oregon Transportation Commission has remained steady at \$6.55 million per year for operating 29 rest areas at 17 locations.

Funding is committed through December 31, 2017.

Future projections assume no increase or decrease in funds, and does not account for capital maintenance or improvement needs.

## RETAINED FUNDS & CAPITAL REPAIRS



TIC has conserved funds from operating expenses through revision of the service delivery model.

These funds will be reinvested for major maintenance and improvements and ADA upgrades.

No further capital maintenance or improvements will be possible without additional funding once retained funds are depleted in FY 2019-20.
