2017-19 Governor's Budget Overview





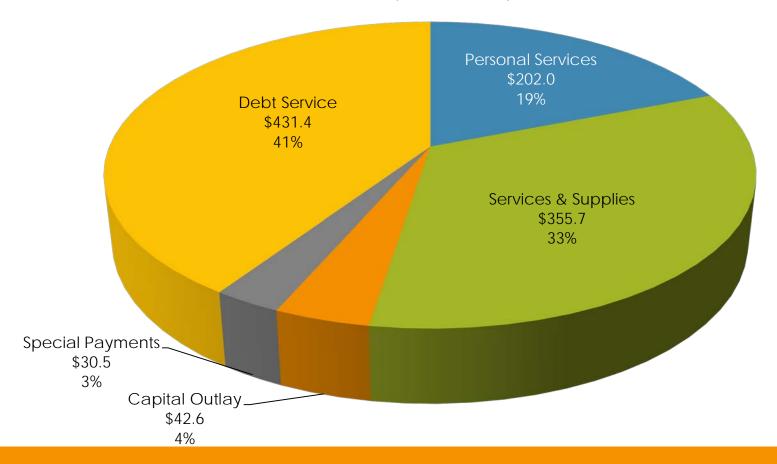
- DAS' approach to budget reductions:
 - DAS' role as service provider means reductions affect other state agencies downstream
 - Focused on reducing costs to customers rather than reducing core services
 - Reduced working capital from 60 to 30 days, saving \$29.5 million in total funds
 - Also reduced \$19.0 million in Other Funds costs, 10 positions (10.00 full-time equivalent) through efficiencies, eliminating non-core functions, lower inflationary adjustments
- Reductions saved \$19.1 million in General Fund / Lottery Funds Statewide

Agency Budget by Expenditure Category (in millions)

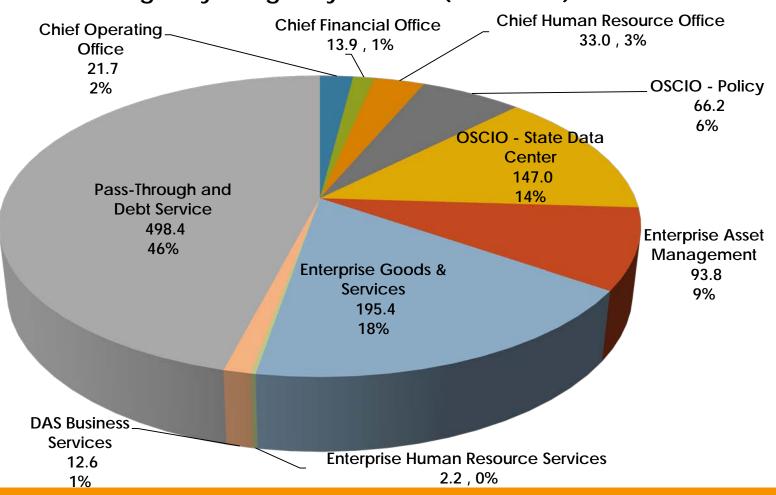

Other Funds

- DAS program revenues come from state agencies or local government customers
 - Assessments pay for policy functions
 - Charges for service pay for service delivery functions

Lottery Funds

 DAS administers the Economic Development Fund, makes transfers to the Education Stability Fund, Parks and Natural Resources Fund and the Oregon Education Fund

General Fund

 Funds the Office of Economic Analysis, payment of debt service, and pass-through payments to non-governmental entities

Major Investments:

- Human Resources Information System \$18.5 million Other Funds, 30 positions (26.50 full-time equivalent)
- Mission Critical Facility Yellow Lot: \$9.3 million Other Funds
- Public Records Positions \$0.6 million General Fund,
 \$0.4 million Other Funds, four positions (4.00 full-time equivalent)
- Centralize IT Security Functions \$11.4 million Other Funds,
 36 positions (35.75 full-time equivalent)

- Capital Constructions were inadvertently left out of Governor's Budget:
 - Portland State Office Building
 - Repairs to Other Buildings
- Governor's Budget makes various reductions to meet GF constraints, alongside targeted investments
