My name is Mardi Solomon and I am a Farm-to-School Program Coordinator in Whatcom County, Washington. I am writing to ask you to support HB 2038, to preserve or expand funding for Oregon's Farm to School and School Garden programs. Although I do not live or work in Oregon, I am very familiar with Oregon's Farm to School and School Garden Network (OFSSGN) and the wonderful work that Oregon's food access and education programs do on behalf of children, families, schools, farms, and food producers.
