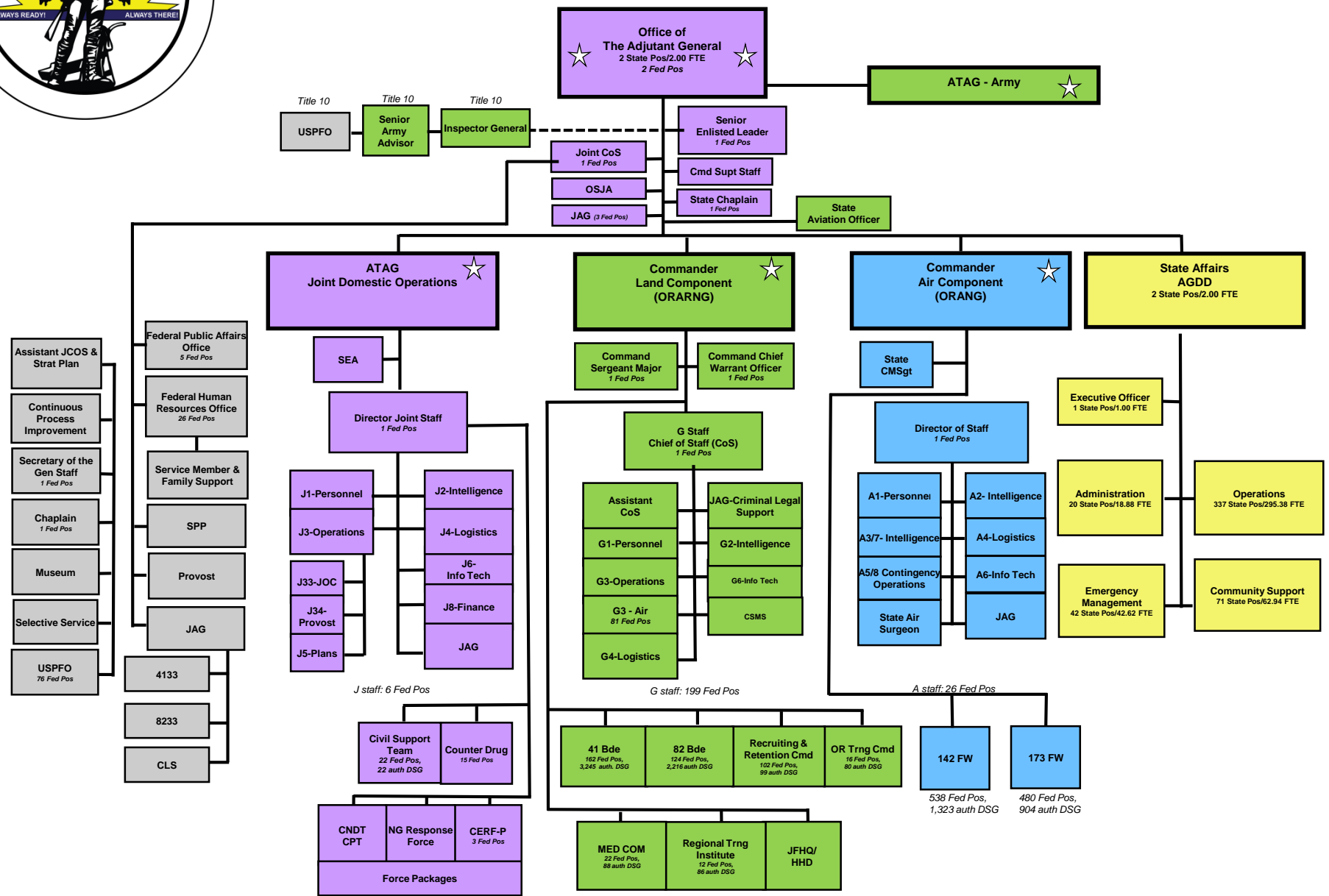


# Priorities

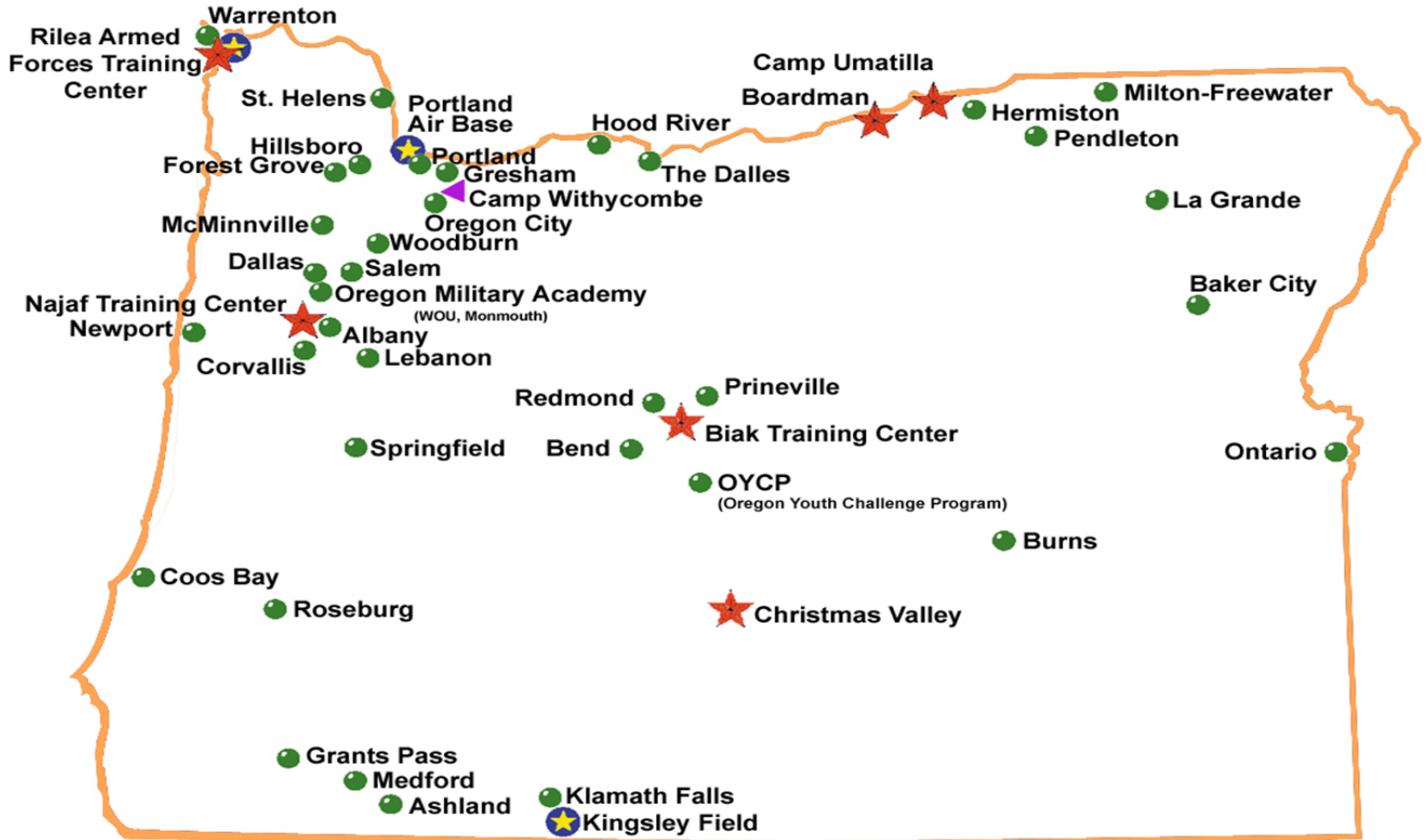
