Subject: SB 130, Waivers fees for obtaining medical marijuana card for veterans who have total disability rating of at least 50 percent

Chair Boquist and members of the committee, I am Mr. Andre Ourso, Section Manager of the Medical Marijuana Program with the Public Health Division of the Oregon Health Authority. I am here to present information related to the medical marijuana program in regards to SB130.

The medical marijuana program currently charges a reduced registry fee of \$20 for all veterans who apply for a medical marijuana card. It is estimated that about 5,300 veterans are currently enrolled in the program. That makes up approximately 9% of the program's applicants. It is unknown how many of the veterans enrolled are rated with a 50% total disability or higher. The number of veterans participating in the program continues to rise each month.

There will be some costs to the program if the \$20 fee is waived for those veterans who have a total disability rating of at least 50%. The cost will be associated with some minor OIS work to modify database systems to address the new fee. Overall, the effect on the program will be minimal.
