As a retired nurse and physician, we have for years advocated for the health and public safety of those in our community, but it was not until we lost our precious son David in a bicycle accident in 2008 that we became acutely aware of the number of trasportation-related injuries and fatalities that occur in Oregon every year. Since then, we have pledged out support and a donation of \$150,000 toward the construction of a two-way protected bikeway from downtown Eugene to the University of Oregon. This bikeway seemed like a perfect opportunity to honor our son, a UO graduate and committed cyclist, while proactively working toward preventing other similar tragedies. Prevention is the key, and, unlike many illnesses and natural disasters, traffic-related accidents CAN ALL BE PREVENTED. We are very hopeful that this bikeway will be constructed, but it will only address cyclists in a small section of Eugene.
