





## Emergency Coordination Center (ECC)



#### Local Incident

- All disasters begin and end locally
- Notifications and activations
- Response and scene stabilization
- Assessment
- Resource allocation & deployment
- Employ mutual aid
- Request Assistance



#### State Agency Coordination

- State agency coordination and response
- 18 Emergency Support Functions (ESF)
  - OERS Council (22 Agencies)
    - All State agencies as needed
  - Mutual aid coordination
- Federal resource requests and coordination
- Situational awareness and reporting


