Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on House Bill 2785. This bill would create an exemption in the Removal-Fill Law for the replacement of a lawfully established agricultural building (as defined in ORS 455.315) that is damaged or destroyed by fire or other act of God. The Department does not have a position on the bill.

The bill would amend the current law by adding an exemption for the "replacement of a lawfully established agricultural building." This could be interpreted to mean that where all local, state, and federal laws were complied with when the original building was constructed, a "replacement" building on the original foot print would be exempt from removal-fill law requirements.

Under the existing removal-fill statutes, as administered by the Department of State Lands, this is already the case. If a new agricultural building were to be constructed in compliance with all applicable laws, the rebuilding of that structure on the original building footprint would not be subject to the removal-fill laws at the time of reconstruction, since it would effectively already be in compliance with such laws. The practical effect of the bill would likely result in a continuation of the status quo, specific to the application of existing removal-fill laws.
