- Expenditures have increased recently due to federal grants, Marketplace, Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) expansion
 - The Governor's Budget supports current services
 - Invests in OSHA inspections, regulation of industry,
 Compact of Free Association (COFA)
 - Changes Marketplace budget to match current expenditure needs


- Personal Services and Services and Supplies pay for regulatory personnel and associated costs
- Special Payments are benefits for injured workers or their families
- Expenditures driven by inflation, changes in legislation to expand scope of services, and changes in the overall economy (e.g. Building Codes)

- Other Funds revenue from fees, taxes, or fines paid by regulated entities
 - Workers Compensation Premium Assessment (6.8 percent of premium)
 - Workers Benefit Fund Assessment (2.8 cents per hour worked)
- Federal Funds are grants for limited purposes
- General Fund pays for insurance premium assistance for COFA Islanders
- DCBS contributes \$151.4 million to the General Fund through insurance tax, fees, and fines
