

# Statewide Survey of Likely General Election Voters in Oregon

*Topline Report - February 16, 2017*

Clout Research conducted a statewide telephone survey of likely general election voters in Oregon from February 10-12, 2017. The hybrid survey included 682 responses reached from landline and mobile telephones, and it carries a confidence interval of 95% and a margin of error of +/- 3.75%.

**Q. In November, Oregon voters overwhelming passed Measure 96, the Oregon Veterans Lottery bill. Voters expected that these dollars would be in addition to the current general fund allocation for veterans. Governor Brown's budget cut 75% of the general fund allocation, \$10 million dollars, out of the veteran's budget. Do you believe the legislature should fully fund veterans services at the promised amount of \$30 million dollars?**
