My name is Mary Nunnenkamp. I am the Chair of the Oregon Law Enforcement Memorial Fund. I am honored to represent the line of duty death survivors who are seeking to have their loved one remembered through the Oregon Fallen Officer Memorial Highway Sign program established in 2011. It's been my honor to work with these families, some for many years, and others over the past year.

Through my work with the Oregon Law Enforcement Memorial Fund, I've gotten to know many of our line of duty death survivors quite well. As Chief Ham shared, it was how Sergeant Goodding lived that made him a hero, not how he died.

When the law enforcement community experiences a line of duty death, we make a promise that is very important to us. We promise to never forget. We promise to support our survivors for as long as they need us. These signs represent one more way for us to keep that promise. These highway memorial signs are incredibly important to them.

The Oregon Law Enforcement Memorial Fund is proud to purchase the sign honoring Seaside Sergeant Jason Goodding to eliminate any expense to the state, the law enforcement agency, or the family.
