House Joint Resolution 6 — Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to the Re: legislative districts of Senators - Oppose

This House Joint Resolution proposes alteration of our Oregon Constitution with regards to voting apportionment. Our position on this is specific and clear:

The Oregon Constitution should provide for a legislative assembly that is apportioned on a population basis, under a system that provides flexibility, adequate safeguards and enforcement procedures ensuring reapportionment after every federal census.

This resolution would apply a dramatic voting representation imbalance to our Legislature. We strongly urge a NO vote.
