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**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Allows brewery-public house licensees to conduct activities except manufacturing at two locations.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Brewery-public house license requirements
- Regulations around beverages to-go
- Creation of the brewery-public house license in 1985

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

Allows brewery-public house licensees to conduct activities except manufacturing at two locations.

**BACKGROUND:**

Brewery-public house licenses were first created in 1985. These licenses allow for manufacture and sale of malt beverages, wine, or cider. There were 104 brewery and brewery-public house licenses in 2005. As of 2016, there are 314, showing a 12 percent year-over-year growth rate.

House Bill 2160 A would allow brewery-public house licensees to hold and sell their products for consumption or retail at two locations, rather than the one that is currently allowed by law.
