#### WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires Department of Human Services (DHS) and Department of Justice (DOJ) to provide trauma-informed training and curriculum including interview models, symptom recognition, assessment tools, data collection, and methods improving placement stability for case planners and other persons involved in child welfare. Specifies trauma-informed training is subject to availability of funds at DHS. Requires DHS to develop written guidelines for trauma-informed practices. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2017.

#### ISSUES DISCUSSED:

#### EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Requires DHS to provide training including trauma-informed curriculum for child welfare employees. Requires training to include trauma-informed interview models, symptom recognition, assessment tools, data collection methods improving placement stability, and techniques for children's recovery and resiliency. Specifies trauma-informed training is subject to availability of funds at DHS. Requires DHS to develop written guidelines for trauma-informed practices. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2017.

#### BACKGROUND:

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration defines trauma-informed care as an intervention and organizational approach that focuses on how trauma may affect an individual's life and their response to behavioral health services from prevention through treatment.

House Bill 2401 A requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) and the Department of Justice (DOJ) to provide trauma-informed training and curriculum for case planners and other persons involved in child welfare. Training must include interview models, symptom recognition, assessment tools, data collection, methods improving placement stability, and techniques for children's recovery and resiliency. DHS is required to develop written guidelines for trauma-informed practices for child welfare employees. The measure also specifies that trauma-informed training is subject to availability of funds at DHS.
