Measure Description:

Requires counties and metropolitan service districts that propose land for designation as urban reserve or rural reserve in written agreement to in fact designate land if specified factors are decided in affirmative.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Counties, Department of Agriculture, Department of Land Conservation and Development, Special Districts

Summary of Expenditure Impact:

Costs related to the measure are indeterminate but are likely to be minimal.

Analysis:

HB 2094 requires lands be designated as an urban or rural reserve if there is a written agreement proposing such a designation. Both counties and the Department of Land Conservation Development (DLCD) assert that there would be some costs related to the measure. In the case of DLCD, the costs appear minimal, but if additional legislation passes similarly affecting the agency, the cumulative effect could result in the need for additional resources. Any additional costs to counties is indeterminate.
