

HB 2303 A STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

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WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Changes coordinated care organization reporting date to Oregon Health Authority from December 31, 2015 to October 1 each year. Deletes statutes predating the Oregon Health Policy Board and references to a Community-based Health Care Initiative that was a previous safety net grant. Specifies that in addition to the director, a director's designee can appoint members to the Advisory Committee on Physician Credentialing Information. Updates statutory language deleting references of Oregon Health Policy and Research to Health Policy and Analytics Division of Oregon Health Authority.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Current coordinated care organization reporting requirement changed from December 31 to October 1
- Deletion of statutory references to the Office of Health Policy and Research
- Authority given to the Health Policy and Analytics Division to collect specific data from hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Deletes statutes predating the Oregon Health Policy Board and references to a Community-based Health Care Initiative that was a previous safety net grant. Specifies that in addition to the director, a director's designee can appoint members to the Advisory Committee on Physician Credentialing Information.

BACKGROUND:

The Health Policy and Analytics (HPA) Division in the Oregon Health Authority provides agency-wide policy development, strategic planning, clinical and Medicaid policy leadership.

The Division develops statewide delivery system technology tools to support care coordination, coordinated care organization and delivery transformation support, and health system performance evaluation reports. The Division also develops and implements innovative approaches to working with its partners to achieve the triple aim of better health, better care and lower costs through the seven program areas within HPA.
