WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires State Landscape Contractors Board (LCB) issue limited landscape construction professional license to person who pays application and license fees. Allows license-holding landscape contracting business to perform landscape work that does not exceed \$8,000 within any 12-month period. Requires business to disclose \$8,000 annual limit on contracts and business cards. Prohibits LCB from issuing license to licensed construction contractors. Prohibits limited landscape construction professionals from planning, installing, maintaining or repairing a deck or arbor attached to a dwelling. Clarifies limited landscape construction professional license fees and ensure license is available within 90 days of effective date of Act.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Barriers to entry-level entrepreneurship pathways in landscape construction industry
- Market-demand for landscaping services often unmet or filled by unlicensed individuals
- Importance of consumer protection
- Tasks that may require additional knowledge and/or skill proficiency demonstration to protect consumer property and water supply
- Importance of clear scope of work for limited licensure
- Potential influence on other trade industries that may seek similar entry-level pathways
- Challenge of enforcing limited scope of practice
- Need for additional amendments in senate

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Requires LCB to issue limited landscape construction professional license to person who pays application and license fees. Allows license-holding landscape contracting business to perform landscape work that does not exceed \$8,000 within any 12-month period. Requires business to disclose \$8,000 annual limit on contracts and business cards. Prohibits LCB from issuing license to licensed construction contractors. Prohibits limited landscape construction professionals from planning, installing, maintaining or repairing a deck or arbor attached to a dwelling. Clarifies limited landscape construction professional licensees may perform all phases of landscape construction work.

BACKGROUND:

Created in 1972, the State Landscape Contractors Board (LCB) licenses landscape contracting businesses and landscape construction professionals. Landscape construction professionals must meet experience and/or education requirements and pass a competency exam or practical skills test. The experience requirement can be satisfied by 24 months of employment with a landscape contracting business or at least 12 months of employment with a landscape contracting business or at least 12 months of employment with a landscape contracting business or at least 12 months of employment with a landscape contracting business or at least 12 months of employment with a landscape contracting business and 12 months of training in a subject related to landscaping from an accredited school.

House Bill 3337-A establishes a limited landscape construction professional license with no experience or education/examination requirements but limits scope of work to projects that do not exceed \$8,000 within any
