**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Allows Department of Corrections (DOC) inmate to perform electrical and plumbing work while under the direct supervision of a licensed electrician or plumber who is an employee of DOC or Oregon Corrections Enterprises (OCE). Allows OCE to supervise inmates participating in a DOC or OCE program pursuant to an agreement between OCE and DOC. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- History of 2013 legislation (House Bill 3245)
- Measure is needed to allow OCE employees to supervise inmates working in OCE work areas

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:**

In 1994, voters passed Measure 17, which amended the Oregon Constitution to require all state prison inmates to be actively engaged in work or training. Oregon Corrections Enterprises (OCE) works with the Department of Corrections (DOC) to provide adult inmates with work and training opportunities. Under current Oregon law, inmates in DOC custody may only perform electrical or plumbing work while under the direct supervision of a DOC employee who is a licensed electrician or plumber. House Bill 2253 allows inmates to perform electrical and plumbing work while under the direct supervision of a licensed electrician or plumber who is an employee of DOC or OCE. HB 2253 also allows OCE to supervise inmates participating in a DOC or OCE program pursuant to an agreement between OCE and DOC.
