WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Modifies the number of voting members of the Oregon State Hospital Advisory Board that can serve on an ad hoc committee established by the Board.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Provisions of measure
- Current make up of Oregon State Hospital Advisory Board

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

The Oregon State Hospital (OSH) provides patient-centered, psychiatric treatment for adults from throughout the state who need hospital-level care. The 16-member Oregon State Hospital Advisory Board created by Senate Bill 25 (2009) includes two nonvoting legislative members and fourteen voting members comprised of advocates for people with mental illness, health care professionals, current or former consumers of services, family advocates, the general public, and OSH employees.

House Bill 2123 modifies the number of voting OSH Advisory Board members that can sit on an ad hoc committee created by the Board to any number that is less than a quorum of the entire OSH Advisory Board.
