#### **BACKGROUND:**

During the 2015-2016 basketball season, the Western Oregon University (WOU) Men's Basketball Team broke multiple school records including the most conference wins in history by posting a 33-4 win-loss record.

The 2015-2016 WOU Men's Basketball Team achieved multiple unprecedented feats in school history by maintaining an undefeated home schedule and earning a season sweep of the Seattle Pacific, Alaska Anchorage and Western Washington teams. They also won the regular season Great Northwest Athletic Conference (GNAC) for the second year in a row and were ranked number one in the nation for three weeks before finishing the year ranked number three nationally.

Their history-making success continued in the post-season when they hosted the 2016 National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II West Regional Championship Tournament as its number one seed. Finishing as the regional champions, the WOU Men's Basketball Team advanced to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight semifinal game, being only the third men's basketball team in the state, at any level, to advance that far in an NCAA championship.

Comprised of 11 native Oregonians, the WOU Men's Basketball Team represented the athletic talent of high schools both large and small in Oregon. Andy Avgi, the team forward, earned several honors including being named Division II Collegiate Commissioners Association West Region Player of the Year and GNAC Player of the Year. Julian Nichols and Tanner Omlid were named to the GNAC second team and Coach Jim Shaw received multiple accolades including the GNAC Coach of the Year.
