

**SB 760 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY**

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**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Requires public or private officials to report suspected abuse of long term care facilities' residents or certain adults with developmental disability or mental illness after any contact with suspected abused person or abuser.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Mandatory reporting provisions
- Contents of the measure

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:**

Oregon law makes certain public and private officials mandatory reporters of suspected abuse of long term care facilities' residents and developmentally disabled or mentally ill adults. The reporting requirement is triggered when the mandatory reporter comes into contact with the suspected abused person or abuser in the reporter's official capacity.

Senate Bill 760 removes the requirement that the contact must be while the mandatory reporter is acting in their official capacity. The measure requires that any contact between the mandatory reporter and the suspected abused person or abuser prompts a mandatory abuse report to the Department of Human Services or law enforcement agency.
