WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Authorizes professional licensing boards to consider, and substitute, relevant experience for high school diploma or equivalent education requirement. Becomes operative January 1, 2018. Effective 91st day following adjournment sine die.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- · Authority of licensing bodies
- Licensure and credential criteria for various occupations
- Current education requirements for various occupations

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

For various occupations, practitioners are required to obtain a license or similar credentials from a professional or regulatory entity. The required criteria for obtaining licensure, certification and other professional and occupational credentials are specific to each occupation, but may include practical training, completion of a certain level of education or passing a relevant exam.

Senate Bill 1028 permits professional licensing boards to consider, and accept, an applicant's relevant experience in the place of a high school diploma or equivalent in order to fulfill licensure, certification or other occupational and professional service authorization requirements.
