WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Bars evidence obtained during sexual assault investigation from being used to arrest or prosecute minor for purchase or possession of alcohol if minor was sexual assault victim and a person contacted emergency services. Bars evidence obtained because minor contacted emergency services to report sexual assault on behalf of another.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Effort to combat stigma surrounding sexual assault
- Prevalence of sexual assault on college campuses
- Risk of sexual assault when alcohol is present
- Rate of underreporting

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Under Oregon law, it is a Class B violation for an individual under 21 years of age to purchase or possess alcohol. *ORS* 471.430. However, minors are immune from prosecution if evidence of the violation is obtained when minors seek medical assistance for themselves or others due to alcohol use. Possession includes the acceptance or consumption of alcohol.

Senate Bill 762-A provides that no victim of a sexual assault crime may be arrested or prosecuted for purchasing or possessing alcohol as a result of evidence obtained during the crime investigation. Under SB 762-A, a victim is eligible for immunity when a person reports the crime to, or seeks assistance from, emergency medical services or law enforcement. The measure defines sexual assault crimes to include rape, sodomy, sexual penetration and sexual abuse. *ORS* 163.355-427. SB 762-A also provides immunity to minors who contact emergency services or law enforcement on behalf of someone who is the victim of a sexual assault crime.
