Recognizes and honors Lance Corporal Ty Lewis Hart (1994-2016) for his service to his country.

**BACKGROUND:**

Lance Corporal Hart was born on April 11, 1994, in Springfield, Oregon, and grew up on his family's farm in Aumsville. He was an exceptional athlete, graduated from Stayton High School in 2012, joined the Marines soon after, and married in 2015. He enjoyed motorcycles, flying, his 1976 pickup truck, spending time with his family, and being a Marine. After enlisting, Lance Corporal Hart trained vigorously to become a member of a helicopter crew. He was a CH-53E Super Stallion helicopter crew chief assigned to the Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 463, Marine Aircraft Group 24, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, stationed at Marine Corps Base Hawaii. He was killed on a nighttime training mission on January 14, 2016, along with 11 fellow Marines, when his and another helicopter collided near the island of Oahu. He is remembered for his remarkable work ethic, determination and commitment, as well as his infectious grin, kindness, positive attitude and unwavering willingness to help others. He was laid to rest on the farm.
