WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

SB 5525 is the fee ratification bill for the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC). The agency set a fee of \$1,000 for an application from a career school in Oregon for the review and approval of a new program at the school. This fee was approved by both HECC and the Department of Administrative Services during the interim. SB 218 (2015) authorized HECC to establish this fee and it was implemented on December 1, 2015. The estimated revenues from this fee is \$32,000 per biennium.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

SB 218 (2015) authorized the establishment of this fee. The regulation of private career schools was transferred to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) from the Department of Education when HECC was created.
