

# A-Engrossed House Bill 2020

Ordered by the House April 21  
Including House Amendments dated April 21

Sponsored by Representative HOLVEY; Representative MARSH

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Establishes Oregon Energy and Climate Board as oversight and advisory body for Oregon Department of Energy and Climate.

Establishes Interagency Climate Coordinating Committee to make recommendations to board **and Legislative Assembly** on ways to coordinate state policies and programs related to energy and climate.

Changes name of State Department of Energy to Oregon Department of Energy and Climate. Changes name of Director of State Department of Energy to Energy and Climate Director.

Abolishes Oregon Global Warming Commission.

Modifies state energy policy.

Modifies general duties of department.

Requires [*board and*] department, **in coordination with board**, to develop [*report on existing policies and programs of agencies of executive department that are related to greenhouse gas emissions or climate change, and to include in report*] proposal for restructuring policies and programs **related to greenhouse gas emissions or climate change** in pursuance of certain goals. Requires board and department to submit [*report*] **proposal** to appropriate interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2018.

Becomes operative January 1, 2018.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to State Department of Energy; creating new provisions; amending ORS 176.820, 244.050,  
3 352.823, 401.054, 469.010, 469.020, 469.030, 469.040, 469.110, 469.120 and 469.605; repealing ORS  
4 468A.210, 468A.215, 468A.220, 468A.225, 468A.230, 468A.235, 468A.240, 468A.245, 468A.250,  
5 468A.255, 468A.260 and 469.426; and prescribing an effective date.

6 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

## ENERGY POLICY

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8  
9  
10 **SECTION 1.** ORS 469.010 is amended to read:

11 469.010. The Legislative Assembly finds and declares that:

12 (1) Continued growth in demand for [*nonrenewable energy forms*] **energy, at affordable cost,**  
13 poses a serious and immediate, as well as future, **concern.** [*problem. It is essential that future gen-*  
14 *erations not be left a legacy of vanished or depleted resources, resulting in massive environmental, so-*  
15 *cial and financial impact.*]

16 (2) It is the goal of Oregon to promote the efficient use of energy resources [*and to develop*  
17 *permanently sustainable energy resources. The need exists for comprehensive state leadership in energy*  
18 *production, distribution and utilization.*] **consistent with state environmental policy.** It is, there-  
19 fore, the policy of Oregon:

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1 (a) That **the** development and use of a diverse array of **affordable, sustainable energy re-**  
2 **sources be encouraged.** [*permanently sustainable energy resources be encouraged utilizing to the*  
3 *highest degree possible the private sector of our free enterprise system.*]

4 (b) That **the development of energy resources be accomplished consistent with state**  
5 **greenhouse gas reduction goals.**

6 [(b)] (c) That through state government example and **policy** [*other effective communications*], en-  
7 ergy conservation and elimination of wasteful and uneconomical uses of energy and materials be  
8 promoted. [*This conservation must include, but not be limited to, resource recovery and materials re-*  
9 *cycling.*]

10 [(c) That the basic human needs of every citizen, present and future, shall be given priority in the  
11 allocation of energy resources, commensurate with perpetuation of a free and productive economy with  
12 special attention to the preservation and enhancement of environmental quality.]

13 (d) That state government assist every citizen and industry in adjusting to [*a diminished avail-*  
14 *ability of energy*] **changes in the available mix of energy resources and to climate change.**

15 (e) That energy-efficient modes of transportation [*for people and goods*] shall be encouraged[,  
16 *while energy-inefficient modes of transportation shall be discouraged*].

17 (f) That cost-effectiveness, **balanced with environmental policy considerations**, be considered  
18 in [*state*] agency decision-making relating to energy sources, facilities or conservation[, *and that*  
19 *cost-effectiveness be considered in all agency decision-making relating to energy facilities*].

20 (g) That state government shall provide a source of impartial and objective information in order  
21 that this energy policy may be enhanced.

22  
23 **OREGON ENERGY AND CLIMATE BOARD**

24  
25 **SECTION 2.** Sections 3, 4, 6 and 7 of this 2017 Act are added to and made a part of ORS  
26 **469.010 to 469.155.**

27  
28 **(Establishment)**

29  
30 **SECTION 3.** (1) **In order to ensure close correspondence among Oregon Department of**  
31 **Energy and Climate policies and programs, the public interest and state climate policies,**  
32 **there is created the Oregon Energy and Climate Board.**

33 (2) **The Energy and Climate Director and an Oregon member of the Pacific Northwest**  
34 **Electric Power and Conservation Planning Council shall serve as ex officio members of the**  
35 **board.**

36 (3) **The Governor shall appoint five members to the board, subject to confirmation by the**  
37 **Senate as provided in ORS 171.562 and 171.565. Members of the board appointed under this**  
38 **subsection must be residents of this state well informed in energy and climate issues and**  
39 **shall include the following:**

40 (a) **One member who is an economist;**

41 (b) **One member from an institution of higher education in Oregon with expertise in en-**  
42 **ergy and climate issues;**

43 (c) **One member who represents residential energy users;**

44 (d) **One member who represents commercial or industrial energy users; and**

45 (e) **One member with expertise in transportation issues.**

1 (4) A member of the board may not hold any pecuniary interest in, have any contract  
2 of employment with, or have any substantial voluntary transactions with any business entity  
3 conduction operations which if conducted in this state would be subject to the energy re-  
4 source supplier assessment imposed under ORS 469.421 (8).

5 **SECTION 4.** (1) The term of office of each member appointed to the Oregon Energy and  
6 Climate Board is four years, but the members of the board may be removed by the Governor.  
7 Before the expiration of the term of a member, the Governor shall appoint a successor to  
8 assume the duties of the member on July 1 of the next following year.

9 (2) A member is eligible for reappointment, but no member may serve more than two  
10 consecutive terms. In case of a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an ap-  
11 pointment to become immediately effective for the unexpired term.

12 (3) The board shall select one of its members as chairperson and another as vice chair-  
13 person, for terms and with duties and powers necessary for the performance of the functions  
14 of the offices as the board determines.

15 (4) A majority of the members of the board constitutes a quorum for the transaction of  
16 business.

17 (5) The board shall meet once during each calendar quarter at a time and place deter-  
18 mined by the chairperson. The board may hold additional meetings at times and places de-  
19 termined by the chairperson or the Energy and Climate Director, or as requested by a  
20 majority of the members.

21 (6) A member of the board is not entitled to compensation but may be reimbursed from  
22 funds available to the board for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by  
23 the member in the performance of the member's official duties in the manner and amount  
24 provided in ORS 292.495.

25 **SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding the term of office specified by section 3 of this 2016 Act,  
26 of the members first appointed by the Governor to the Oregon Energy and Climate Board:

27 (1) One shall serve for a term ending July 1, 2019.

28 (2) One shall serve for a term ending July 1, 2020.

29 (3) One shall serve for a term ending July 1, 2021.

30 (4) Two shall serve for terms ending July 1, 2022.

31  
32 (Duties)

33  
34 **SECTION 6.** (1) The Oregon Energy and Climate Board shall advise the Oregon Depart-  
35 ment of Energy and Climate regarding:

36 (a) The implementation, administration and enforcement of department programs and  
37 activities;

38 (b) The development of department policies in accordance with the policy stated in ORS  
39 469.010 and state environmental policies; and

40 (c) The preparation for submission to the Governor budget forms under ORS 291.208 for  
41 purposes related to the compilation and preparation of the Governor's budget under ORS  
42 291.216.

43 (2) In advising the department under subsection (1) of this section the board shall give  
44 due regard to the department's role in aiding agencies of the executive department as defined  
45 in ORS 174.122 in the achievement of the greenhouse gas reduction goals established by ORS

1 **468A.205.**

2 (3) By arrangement with the chairperson, the Energy and Climate Director shall review  
3 with the board the activities of the department and, subject to policy direction by the board,  
4 outline the methods, policies and program of work for the department.

5 (4) The board shall receive regular reports from the Energy Facility Siting Council and  
6 the Oregon Hanford Cleanup Board.

7 (5) The board shall hold public hearings and provide an opportunity for public comment  
8 in carrying out the board's activities under this section.

9  
10 **INTERAGENCY CLIMATE COORDINATING COMMITTEE**

11  
12 **SECTION 7.** (1) The Interagency Climate Coordinating Committee is established, con-  
13 sisting of the following ex officio members:

14 (a) The Director of Transportation;

15 (b) The chairperson of the Public Utility Commission of Oregon;

16 (c) The Director of the Department of Environmental Quality;

17 (d) The Director of Agriculture;

18 (e) The State Forester;

19 (f) The Water Resources Director;

20 (g) The Director of the Oregon Business Development Department;

21 (h) The State Fish and Wildlife Director;

22 (i) The Energy and Climate Director;

23 (j) The Director of the Department of Land Conservation and Development;

24 (k) The Director of the Housing and Community Services Department;

25 (L) The Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services; and

26 (m) Any number of additional ex officio members, each from a state agency, as the  
27 Oregon Energy and Climate Board determines are necessary to ensure that all state agencies  
28 charged with administering policies or programs related to energy and climate are repres-  
29 ented on the committee.

30 (2) The committee shall, as requested by the Oregon Energy and Climate Board, collab-  
31 orate to identify and evaluate existing programs, policies and activities in order to make  
32 recommendations to the Oregon Energy and Climate Board and the Legislative Assembly on  
33 ways to coordinate state policies, programs and activities related to energy and climate, with  
34 a focus on better coordination of policies or programs so as to increase the effectiveness of  
35 efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Oregon while achieving the mission and pur-  
36 pose of each agency represented on the committee.

37 (3) The committee shall meet with the Oregon Energy and Climate Board at such times  
38 and places as are specified by the call of the chairperson of the Oregon Energy and Climate  
39 Board.

40 (4) Nothing in this section may be construed to limit the authority of any state agency  
41 to carry out state policies, programs or activities related to energy and climate.

42  
43 **CLIMATE POLICY AND PROGRAM PROPOSAL**

44  
45 **SECTION 8.** (1) The Oregon Department of Energy and Climate, in coordination with the

1 **Oregon Energy and Climate Board, shall develop and submit a proposal, including recom-**  
2 **mendations for legislation, for restructuring this state's policies and programs related to**  
3 **greenhouse gas emissions or climate change, with the goals of ensuring that:**

4 (a) **The State of Oregon has a designated agency that is charged with a definitive lead-**  
5 **ership role in climate policy and program coordination, development, analysis and**  
6 **prioritization;**

7 (b) **All state climate policies and programs are administered in a well-coordinated manner**  
8 **that positions this state to achieve the greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals set forth**  
9 **in ORS 468A.205; and**

10 (c) **All agencies of the executive department have systems in place to accurately evalu-**  
11 **ate:**

12 (A) **The effectiveness of climate policies or programs administered by the agencies;**

13 (B) **Future objectives related to climate and how those objectives may be best achieved**  
14 **in a coordinated manner; and**

15 (C) **Additional greenhouse gas mitigation strategies that may be pursued by the agencies.**

16 (2) **The department and the board shall submit the proposal required by this section to**  
17 **the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than September 15,**  
18 **2018.**

19 **SECTION 9. Section 8 of this 2017 Act is repealed on December 31, 2018.**

20  
21 **PROVISIONS ABOLISHING GLOBAL WARMING COMMISSION**

22  
23 **SECTION 10. The Oregon Global Warming Commission is abolished.**

24 **SECTION 11. ORS 468A.210, 468A.215, 468A.220, 468A.225, 468A.230, 468A.235, 468A.240,**  
25 **468A.245, 468A.250, 468A.255 and 468A.260 are repealed.**

26 **SECTION 12. (1) The Chairperson of the Oregon Global Warming Commission shall:**

27 (a) **Deliver to the Oregon Department of Energy and Climate all records, property and**  
28 **work product within the jurisdiction of the chairperson that relate to the duties, functions**  
29 **and powers of the Oregon Global Warming Commission as those duties, functions and powers**  
30 **existed prior to the effective date of the abolishment of the commission by section 10 of this**  
31 **2017 Act.**

32 (2) **The Energy and Climate Director shall take possession of the records, property and**  
33 **work product.**

34 (3) **The Governor shall resolve any dispute between the Oregon Global Warming Com-**  
35 **mission and the Oregon Department of Energy and Climate relating to transfers of records,**  
36 **property and work product under this section, and the Governor's decision is final.**

37 **SECTION 13. ORS 352.823 is amended to read:**

38 352.823. (1) **The Oregon Climate Change Research Institute is established at Oregon State Uni-**  
39 **versity. In administering the institute, Oregon State University may seek the cooperation of other**  
40 **public universities listed in ORS 352.002.**

41 (2) **The purpose of the Oregon Climate Change Research Institute is to:**

42 (a) **Facilitate research by faculty at public universities listed in ORS 352.002 on climate change**  
43 **and its effects on natural and human systems in Oregon;**

44 (b) **Serve as a clearinghouse for climate change information;**

45 (c) **Provide climate change information to the public in integrated and accessible formats; and**





1 tended to change the name of the “Director of the State Department of Energy” to the  
2 “Energy and Climate Director.”

3 (2) For the purpose of harmonizing and clarifying statute sections published in Oregon  
4 Revised Statutes, the Legislative Counsel may substitute for words designating the “Director  
5 of the State Department of Energy,” wherever they occur in Oregon Revised Statutes, other  
6 words designating the “Energy and Climate Director.”

7 **SECTION 18.** ORS 469.110 is amended to read:

8 469.110. (1) At the direction of the **Energy and Climate** Director [*of the State Department of*  
9 *Energy*] **and of the Oregon Energy and Climate Board**, the [*State*] **Oregon** Department of Energy  
10 **and Climate** may represent the state’s energy-related interests in any matter involving the federal  
11 government, its departments or agencies, which is within the scope of the power and duties of the  
12 [*State*] **Oregon** Department of Energy **and Climate**, and may, upon request, represent the interest  
13 of a county, city, state agency, federally recognized Native American or American Indian tribe,  
14 special district or owner or operator of an energy facility.

15 (2) At the direction of the director **and the board**, the department may intervene in any pro-  
16 ceeding undertaken by an agency for the purpose of expressing its views as to the effect of an  
17 agency action, upon state energy resources and state energy policy.

18  
19 **(Repeal of Energy Advisory Work Group)**

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21 **SECTION 19.** ORS 469.426 is repealed.

26 176.820. There is continuously appropriated from the Motor Vehicle Division Account to the

41 (e) The Deputy Secretary of State.

16 and 244.090.

17 (3) By April 15 next after the filing deadline for the primary election, each candidate described  
18 in subsection (1) of this section shall file with the commission a statement of economic interest as  
19 required under ORS 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090.

20 (4) Within 30 days after the filing deadline for the general election, each candidate described in  
21 subsection (1) of this section who was not a candidate in the preceding primary election, or who  
22 was nominated for public office described in subsection (1) of this section at the preceding primary  
23 election by write-in votes, shall file with the commission a statement of economic interest as re-  
24 quired under ORS 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090.

25 (5) Subsections (1) to (4) of this section apply only to persons who are incumbent, elected or  
26 appointed public officials as of April 15 and to persons who are candidates on April 15. Subsections  
27 (1) to (4) of this section also apply to persons who do not become candidates until 30 days after the  
28 filing deadline for the statewide general election.

29 (6) If a statement required to be filed under this section has not been received by the commis-  
30 sion within five days after the date the statement is due, the commission shall notify the public of-  
31 ficial or candidate and give the public official or candidate not less than 15 days to comply with the  
32 requirements of this section. If the public official or candidate fails to comply by the date set by the  
33 commission, the commission may impose a civil penalty as provided in ORS 244.350.
