House Bill 2045

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Authorizes Oregon Health Authority to waive or reduce inadvertent or unintentional overpayment of medical assistance claim for prescription drug.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to overpayments of medical assistance; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. The Oregon Health Authority may waive or reduce an overpayment of medical assistance assessed by the authority based on an audit of a medical assistance claim for reimbursement of the cost of a prescription drug if:
 - (1) The overpayment was caused by inadvertence or was unintentional; and
 - (2) The individual who was overpaid agrees to take remedial steps proposed by the authority, including but not limited to additional training, that are intended to reduce the likelihood of future overpayments.
 - <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2017 Act applies to overpayments assessed or collected on or after the effective date of this 2017 Act.
 - SECTION 3. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
