House Bill 2145

Sponsored by Representative JOHNSON; Representative WHISNANT (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Establishes lower minimum wage for work-study students, adjusted annually for inflation. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to minimum wage rate for work-study students; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 653.025, regardless of employer location, for each hour of work time that a participant in a program that provides students in secondary or post-secondary educational institutions with employment opportunities for financial aid is gainfully employed, an employer may employ or agree to employ the participant at wages computed at a rate lower than the rate under ORS 653.025, but may not employ or agree to employ the participant at wages computed at a rate lower than \$9.25, adjusted annually for inflation as provided in subsection (2) of this section.

(2) No later than April 30 of each year, the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries shall calculate an adjustment of the wage amount described in subsection (1) of this section based upon the increase, if any, from March of the preceding year to March of the year in which the calculation is made in the U.S. City Average Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers for All Items as prepared by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the United States Department of Labor or its successor.

SECTION 2. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
