House Bill 2148

Sponsored by Representative JOHNSON; Representative BARKER (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Allows construction contractor or subcontractor to post retainage bond as substitute for moneys being withheld as retainage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to retainage bonds; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 701.410 and 701.420.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) A contractor or subcontractor may, before commencing performance on a construction project, execute and deliver a good and sufficient bond to an owner, contractor or subcontractor in the amount of any retainage the owner, contractor or subcontractor would be authorized under ORS 701.420 to withhold from the contractor or subcontractor based on the contract price. After commencing performance, a contractor or subcontractor may execute and deliver a good and sufficient bond to an owner, contractor or subcontractor in the amount of any retainage on the contract price that has not been paid to the contractor or subcontractor by the owner, contractor or subcontractor.

- (2) A bond under this section must be payable for claims and liens, in the same amounts, manner and priority that the claims and liens would be payable from moneys withheld as retainage. The bond must be payable for claims made prior to 30 days after the contractor or subcontractor completes work under the contract and the work is accepted by the owner. The bond must be issued by one or more corporate sureties authorized to do business in this state.
- (3) If a contractor or subcontractor delivers a bond to an owner, contractor or subcontractor under this section before the contractor or subcontractor commences work, the owner, contractor or subcontractor must accept the bond as security in lieu of withholding retainage from the amounts payable to the contractor or subcontractor. If the contractor or subcontractor delivers the bond after commencing work, the owner, contractor or subcontractor receiving the bond shall immediately release any amounts earned by the contractor or subcontractor that have been withheld as retainage and shall cease further withholdings of retainage from amounts due the contractor or subcontractor.
- (4) If a contractor or subcontractor delivers a bond under this section, and later executes and delivers a performance bond under ORS 701.430, the contractor or subcontractor may reduce the amount of the performance bond by the amount of the bond executed and delivered under this section.
- (5) A bond described in this section shall expire 30 days after the contractor or subcontractor completes work under the contract and the work is accepted by the owner.

(6) This section does not apply to a public contract described in ORS 701.435.

SECTION 2. ORS 701.420 is amended to read:

701.420. (1) Partial payment is allowed and may be made on contracts for construction and home improvement. Except as otherwise provided in ORS 701.430, 701.435 or section 1 of this 2017 Act, an owner, contractor or subcontractor may withhold as retainage an amount equal to not more than five percent of the contract price of the work completed. Partial payment allowed under this subsection is not acceptance or approval of some of the work or a waiver of defects in the work.

- (2) The owner, contractor or subcontractor shall pay interest at the rate of one percent per month on the final payment due the contractor or subcontractor. The interest shall commence 30 days after the contractor or subcontractor has completed and the owner has accepted the work under the contract for construction for which the final payment is due. The interest shall run until the date when final payment is tendered to the contractor or subcontractor. When the contractor or subcontractor considers the work that the contractor or subcontractor is contracted to perform to be complete, the contractor or subcontractor shall notify the party to whom the contractor or subcontractor is responsible for performing the construction work under the contract. The party shall, within 15 days after receiving the notice, either accept the work or notify the contractor or subcontractor of work yet to be performed under the contract. If the party does not accept the work or does not notify the contractor or subcontractor of work yet to be performed within the time allowed, the interest required under this subsection shall commence 30 days after the end of the 15-day period.
- (3) [When a contractor pays a subcontractor in full, including the amount the contractor withheld as retainage, the owner with whom the contractor has the contract shall pay the contractor, out of the amount that the owner withheld from the contractor as retainage, a sum equal to the amount of retainage that the contractor paid the subcontractor.] If a contractor pays a subcontractor in full including any retainage withheld by the contractor, and the owner has withheld retainage from the contractor, the owner shall pay the contractor out of the retainage withheld by the owner an amount equal to five percent of the full amount that the contractor paid the subcontractor. The contractor shall notify the owner when the contractor pays a subcontractor in full under this section and the owner shall, within 15 days after receiving the notice, pay the contractor the amount due the contractor under this subsection. Interest on the amount due the contractor at the rate of one percent per month shall commence 30 days after the owner receives notice of full payment to the subcontractor.

SECTION 3. ORS 701.410 is amended to read:

701.410. (1) As used in ORS 279C.555, 279C.570, 701.410, 701.420, 701.430, 701.435 and 701.440 and section 1 of this 2017 Act:

- (a) "Construction" means:
- (A) Excavating, landscaping, demolishing and detaching existing structures, leveling, filling in and otherwise preparing land for the making and placement of a building, structure or superstructure;
 - (B) Creating or making a building, structure or superstructure; and
- (C) Altering, partially constructing and doing repairs in and upon a building, structure or superstructure.
- (b) "Contractor" means a person that contracts with an owner on predetermined terms to be responsible for performing all or part of a job of construction in accordance with established specifications or plans, and that retains control of the means, method and manner of accomplishing the

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- (c) "Owner" means a person that is or claims to be the owner in fee or a lesser estate of the land, building, structure or superstructure on which construction is performed and that enters into an agreement with a contractor for the construction.
- (d) "Subcontractor" means a person that contracts with a contractor or another subcontractor on predetermined terms to be responsible for performing all or part of a job of construction in accordance with established specifications or plans.
- (2) As used in ORS 701.410, 701.420, 701.430, 701.435 and 701.440 and section 1 of this 2017 Act, "retainage" means the difference between the amount a contractor or subcontractor earns under a construction contract and the amount the owner pays on the contract to the contractor, the amount the contractor pays on the contract to the subcontractor or the amount the subcontractor pays on the contract to another subcontractor.

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
