## House Bill 2197

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of Joint Interim Committee on Marijuana Legalization)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to enter into agreement with nongovernmental entity that conducts or funds research on cannabis and cannabis-derived products. Specifies terms of agreement. Requires public dissemination of data, information, analysis and findings procured pursuant to research.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to cannabis; and prescribing an effective date.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Oregon Liquor Control Commission shall enter into an agreement with a nongovernmental entity that conducts or funds research on cannabis and cannabisderived products.
    - (2) An agreement entered into under subsection (1) of this section must require that:
    - (a) The nongovernmental entity conduct or fund research for the following purposes:
  - (A) To improve and advance public health policy and public safety policy with respect to cannabis and cannabis-derived products;
  - (B) To develop and improve agronomic and horticultural practices with respect to cannabis;
  - (C) To develop and improve medical and pharmacopoeial practices with respect to cannabis and cannabis-derived products;
  - (D) To identify environmental best practices with respect to the production of cannabis and the processing of cannabis-derived products; and
    - (E) To enhance the commercial value of cannabis and cannabis-derived products.
  - (b) The nongovernmental entity provide the commission with all data, information, analysis and findings procured pursuant to research that is funded in whole or in part by moneys received under the agreement.
  - (c) The nongovernmental entity allow the commission to inspect, after providing notice, any financial record related to research that is funded in whole or in part by moneys received under the agreement.
  - (d) The nongovernmental entity arrange, during the term of the agreement, to be audited by the Secretary of State or an independent auditor selected by the Secretary of State, and provide to the commission all records related to the audit.
  - (e) Each officer of the nongovernmental entity and each member of the governing body of the nongovernmental entity:
    - (A) File with the commission on or before April 15 of each year a statement disclosing

- the economic interests of the officer or member that contains the same information as a statement of economic interest described in ORS 244.060;
- (B) At meetings of the governing body of the nongovernmental entity, declare any actual conflict of interest or potential conflict of interest, as those terms are defined in ORS 244.020, whenever an actual conflict of interest or potential conflict of interest arises; and
- (C) At meetings of the governing body of the nongovernmental entity, abstain from participating in any discussion or decision making process involving an actual conflict of interest as defined in ORS 244.020.
- (f) For the purposes specified in subsection (4) of this section, the nongovernmental entity establish, provide services for and pay the expenses of an independent oversight committee consisting of the following members:
  - (A) An expert in public health policy;

- (B) An expert in public safety policy;
- (C) An expert in agronomic and horticultural practices;
- (D) An expert in medical and pharmacopoeial practices;
- (E) A representative of persons licensed under ORS 475B.010 to 475B.395 and registered under ORS 475B.400 to 475B.525;
  - (F) A representative of persons licensed under ORS 475B.560;
  - (G) One member of the Senate selected by the President of the Senate; and
- (H) One member of the House of Representatives selected by the Speaker of the House.
- (3) An agreement entered into under this section must be for a term that does not exceed one year, but may be renewed upon the expiration of a term.
- (4) The independent oversight committee established pursuant to subsection (2)(f) of this section:
- (a) Shall advise the nongovernmental entity on potential opportunities for researching cannabis and cannabis-derived products;
- (b) Shall examine all data, information, analysis and findings procured pursuant to research that is funded in whole or in part by moneys received under an agreement entered into under this section;
- (c) Shall file an annual report with the commission evaluating all data, information, analysis and findings procured pursuant to research that is funded in whole or in part by moneys received under an agreement entered into under this section;
- (d) Shall nominate individuals for the governing body of the nongovernmental entity to consider when the governing body appoints officers;
- (e) Shall nominate individuals for the governing body of the nongovernmental entity to consider when the governing body fills a vacancy within the governing body; and
- (f) Shall serve any other function as specified in the terms of an agreement entered into under this section.
- (5) The commission shall post all information received by the commission pursuant to this section on a website of the commission. In conjunction with the information, the commission shall post a summary of the information that is written in plain language and easy to understand.
- (6) On or before February 1 of each year, the commission shall report to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly, in the manner required by ORS 192.245, a summary of all data, information, analysis and findings procured pursuant to research that

- is funded in whole or in part by moneys received under an agreement entered into under this section.
  - (7) The commission may adopt rules to implement this section.
  - (8) Upon request of the commission, the Oregon Health Authority and the State Department of Agriculture shall assist the commission with the commission's duties under this section.
  - SECTION 2. This 2017 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2017 regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
