

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2238

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “137.656” delete the rest of the line and delete lines
2 3 and 4 and insert “and 251.185 and sections 1, 3 and 5, chapter 600, Oregon Laws 2013; repealing
3 section 10, chapter 600, Oregon Laws 2013; and declaring an emergency.”.

4 Delete lines 6 through 22 and delete pages 2 and 3.

5 On page 4, delete lines 1 through 38.

6 In line 39, delete “9” and insert “1”.

7 On page 5, line 43, delete “10” and insert “2”.

8 On page 6, delete lines 1 through 3 and insert:

9 “(2)(a) Upon written request from a member of the Legislative Assembly from each major poli-
10 tical party, the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall prepare a racial and ethnic impact
11 statement on proposed legislation that is related to crime and likely to have an effect on the crim-
12 inal justice system.”.

13 In line 18, delete “11” and insert “3” and after the period delete the rest of the line and delete
14 lines 19 and 20 and insert “(1)(a) Upon written request from a member of the Legislative Assembly
15 from each major political party, the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall prepare a racial and
16 ethnic impact statement for a state measure that is related to crime and likely to have an effect on
17 the criminal justice system.”.

18 In line 23, delete “10” and insert “2”.

19 In line 24, delete “10” and insert “2”.

20 In line 45, delete “12” and insert “4”.

21 On page 7, line 23, delete “13” and insert “5”.

22 On page 8, line 6, delete “14” and insert “6”.

23 In line 7, delete “15” and insert “7”.

24 Delete lines 34 through 37 and insert:

25 “(e) To prepare the racial and ethnic impact statements described in sections 2 and 3 of this
26 2017 Act.”.

27 On page 9, delete lines 2 through 45 and delete page 10 and insert:

28 “**SECTION 8.** ORS 251.185, as amended by section 8, chapter 600, Oregon Laws 2013, and sec-
29 tion 5, chapter 72, Oregon Laws 2014, is amended to read:

30 “251.185. (1) The Secretary of State shall have printed in the voters’ pamphlet for a general
31 election or any special election a copy of the title and text of each state measure to be submitted
32 to the people at the election for which the pamphlet was prepared. The pamphlet must include the
33 procedures for filing a complaint under ORS 260.345. Each measure shall be printed in the pamphlet
34 with:

35 “(a) The number and ballot title of the measure;

1 “(b) The financial estimates and any statement prepared for the measure under ORS 250.125;

2 “(c) The explanatory statement prepared for the measure;

3 “(d) Arguments relating to the measure and filed with the Secretary of State; *[and]*

4 “(e) **Any racial and ethnic impact statement prepared for the measure under section 3,**
5 **chapter 600, Oregon Laws 2013, or section 3 of this 2017 Act; and**

6 “[*e*] (f) Any statement submitted for the measure by a citizen panel under ORS 250.141.

7 “(2) A county measure or measure of a metropolitan service district organized under ORS
8 chapter 268, and ballot title, explanatory statement and arguments relating to the measure, filed by
9 the county or metropolitan service district under ORS 251.285 shall be included in the voters’ pam-
10 phlet described in subsection (1) of this section if required under ORS 251.067.

11 “**SECTION 9.** ORS 251.185, as amended by section 8, chapter 600, Oregon Laws 2013, section
12 5, chapter 72, Oregon Laws 2014, and section 8 of this 2017 Act, is amended to read:

13 “251.185. (1) The Secretary of State shall have printed in the voters’ pamphlet for a general
14 election or any special election a copy of the title and text of each state measure to be submitted
15 to the people at the election for which the pamphlet was prepared. The pamphlet must include the
16 procedures for filing a complaint under ORS 260.345. Each measure shall be printed in the pamphlet
17 with:

18 “(a) The number and ballot title of the measure;

19 “(b) The financial estimates and any statement prepared for the measure under ORS 250.125;

20 “(c) The explanatory statement prepared for the measure;

21 “(d) Arguments relating to the measure and filed with the Secretary of State;

22 “(e) Any racial and ethnic impact statement prepared for the measure under [*section 3, chapter*
23 *600, Oregon Laws 2013, or]* section 3 of this 2017 Act; and

24 “(f) Any statement submitted for the measure by a citizen panel under ORS 250.141.

25 “(2) A county measure or measure of a metropolitan service district organized under ORS
26 chapter 268, and ballot title, explanatory statement and arguments relating to the measure, filed by
27 the county or metropolitan service district under ORS 251.285 shall be included in the voters’ pam-
28 phlet described in subsection (1) of this section if required under ORS 251.067.

29 “**SECTION 10. Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the**
30 **2023 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.**

31 “**SECTION 11.** Section 5, chapter 600, Oregon Laws 2013, is amended to read:

32 “**Sec. 5. (1)** [*Sections 1 to 4 of this 2013 Act*] **Sections 2 and 4, chapter 600, Oregon Laws 2013,**
33 **are repealed on January 2, 2018.**

34 “**(2) Sections 1 and 3, chapter 600, Oregon Laws 2013, as amended by sections 4 and 5 of**
35 **this 2017 Act, are repealed on January 2, 2018.**

36 “**SECTION 12.** The amendments to ORS 251.185 by section 9 of this 2017 Act become op-
37 **erative on January 2, 2018.**

38 “**SECTION 13.** Section 3 of this 2017 Act and the amendments to ORS 251.185 by section
39 **9 of this 2017 Act apply to elections held on or after the first Tuesday after the first Monday**
40 **in November 2018.**

41 “**SECTION 14.** This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
42 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect**
43 **on its passage.”.**
